Goals for Each Resident

Develop Strong Leadership Skills: Gain hands-on experience in leading various church activities and groups.

Deepen Theological Understanding: Complete a comprehensive study of systematic theology and articulate personal beliefs. (Pastoral Residents)

Enhance Preaching Abilities: Preach regularly in different settings and receive constructive feedback. (Pastoral Residents)

Cultivate Pastoral Care Skills: Participate in counseling, visitation, and community involvement to understand the pastoral role.

Grow in Spiritual Disciplines: Strengthen personal spiritual practices through dedicated mentorship and accountability.

Application Process

Timeline:

- August: Finalize program with the Elders and create the application
- September October: Advertise and hold informational meetings; collect applications
- **November:** Conduct interviews
- **December:** Formulate individual program plans
- **January 1st:** Start the residency program
